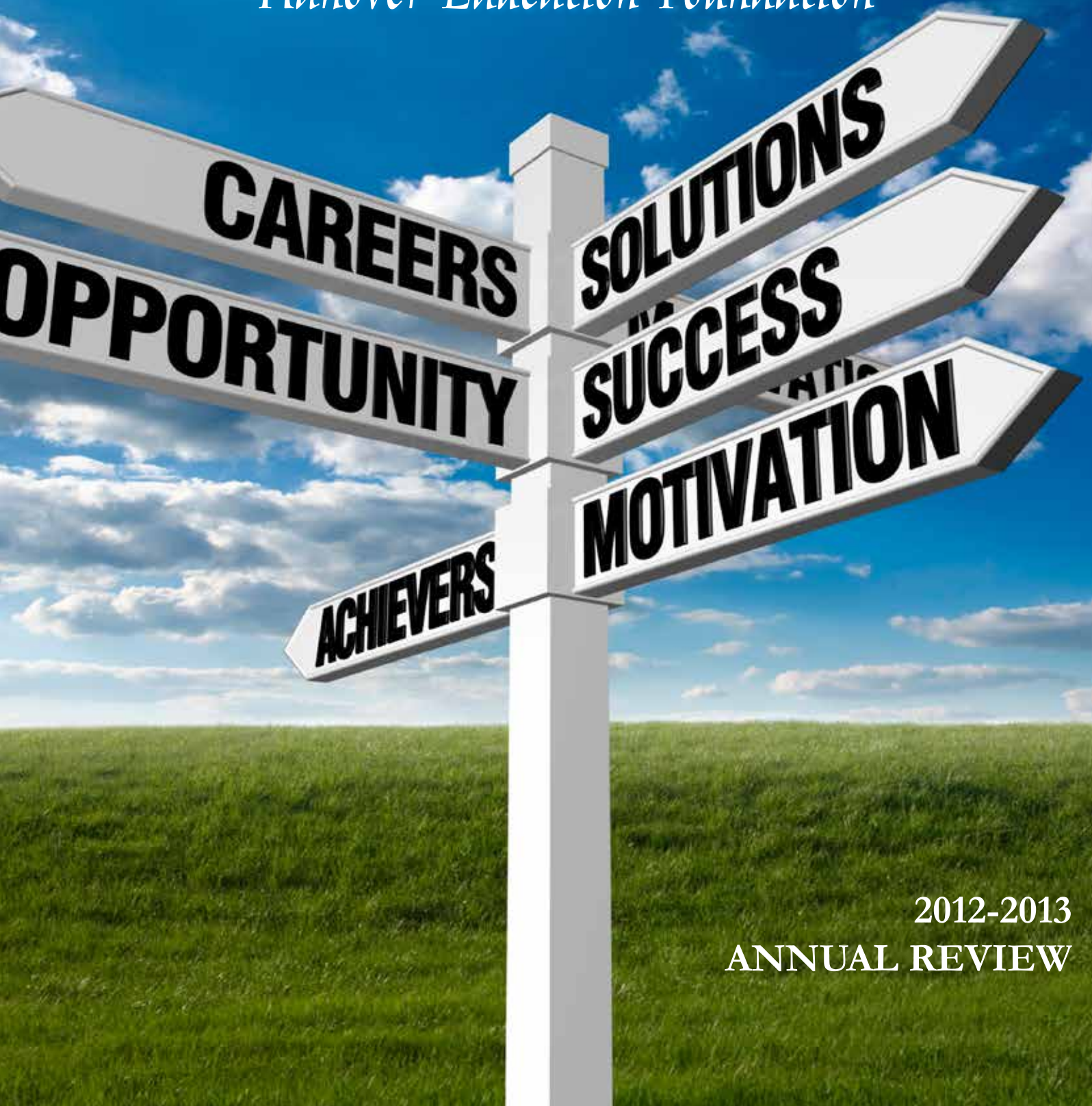


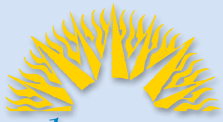

# Memorial Brick Dedication Held at Patrick Henry High School

At the ceremony, new bricks were put in place to honor deceased classmates from Patrick Henry High School.



On Friday, November 2, 2012, several members of the Patrick Henry High School Class of 1964 gathered at the school to celebrate the lives of their departed classmates. M. Addison Jones, Jr., Executive Vice President for The Supply Room Companies, and Kit Taylor, a retired registered nurse, both from the Class of 1964 spearheaded the project designated to provide a permanent monument in memory of deceased classmates from the Patrick Henry High School community.

In 1999, an area in front of the school was designed as a prominent place to honor former students, faculty and staff. The project led by Mr. Jones and Mrs. Taylor expanded the memorial as bricks were placed in memory of individuals from the Classes of 1964, 1965, 1966, 1968, and 1999. Names of the deceased students were read as family members placed a brick at the site.

During the ceremony, members of the committee presented Margaret Hill, Executive Director of the Hanover Education Foundation, with a donation of \$500 to further honor their classmates.

## Superintendent's Professional Development Scholarship Award

In 1999, the Hanover Education Foundation (HEF) established the Superintendent's Professional Development Scholarship to recognize Dr. Stewart Roberson's achievement as Virginia's Superintendent of the Year. The scholarship is awarded annually to a teacher who demonstrates the potential of achieving greater heights within the classroom. Funds from this scholarship can go to tuition, books, travel and other activities related to valuable professional development opportunities.

Ms. Donaldson will utilize the funding to attend a three day Impact Therapy Workshop at West Virginia University. Impact therapy is an active, multi-sensory, creative, theory-driven approach to counseling.

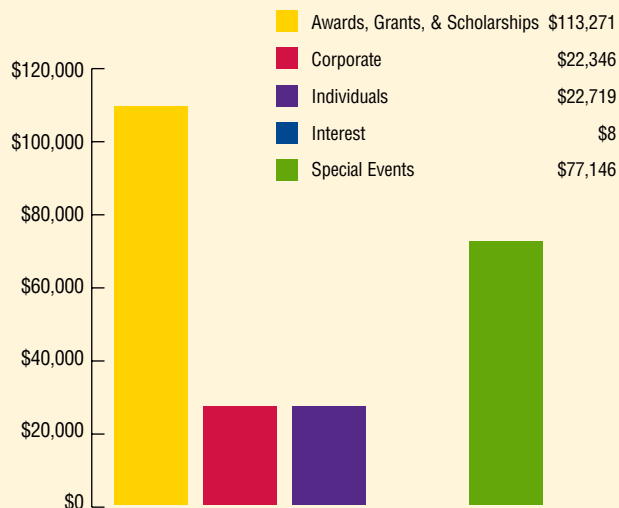

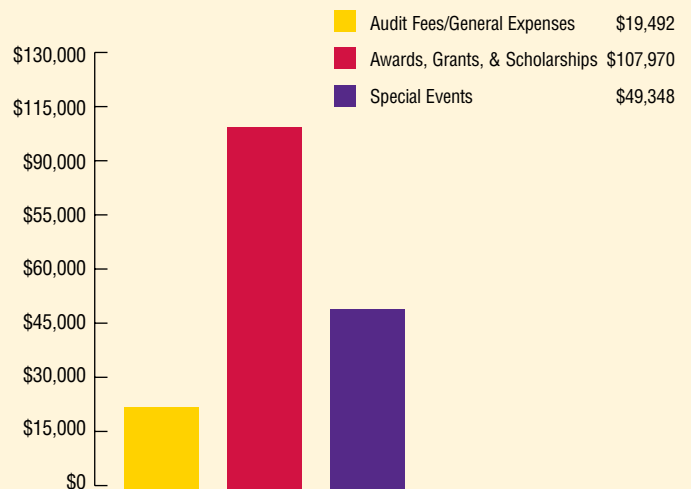

# Scholarships Awarded through Hanover Education Foundation

*Scholarships totaling over \$58,000 were awarded to 34 seniors in Hanover County Public schools as they continue to pursue training and educational opportunities beyond high school. The HEF was pleased to add three new scholarships this year thanks to the family of Austin Brown Pleasants, Patrick Henry Class of 1973, who set up the Luther W. White Memorial Scholarship, and The Insurance Doctor.*

**Al Gardner Horticulture Scholarship Fund** – \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior from Patrick Henry High School with a stated intention of following a post-high school study of Horticulture, Biology, Environmental Science, Landscaping Design, or other related fields in the Natural Sciences.

**Austin Brown Pleasants Memorial Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior in the memory of Austin B. Pleasants who passed away while attending Patrick Henry High School. The criteria for this Patrick Henry High School scholarship are having a GPA of 3.0, participation in Church Youth Organization and demonstration of positive leadership and citizenship skills.

**Beth O'Brien Hubbard Memorial Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarships awarded to a graduating senior from all four high schools and The Georgetown School having a GPA of 3.0 and enrolled in a four-year college majoring in the business field. The awardee should show positive work ethics and leadership skills.

**Bette J. Harmon Memorial Scholarship** – \$2,000 scholarship given in memory of Bette Harmon, a long time librarian in Hanover County Public Schools, to a graduating senior from Atlee High School and Lee-Davis High School with a desire in continuing a post-high school education in pursuance of a bachelor's degree in either English or Education at a four-year college or university.

**Covenant Woods Scholarship** – \$750 scholarship will be given to one student in each of the four high schools that is interested in pursuing a career in the medical field or senior living.

**Eleanor J. Sydnor Honor Award** – \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to two graduating seniors at Patrick Henry High School majoring in Education. This scholarship, which was set up by the Class of 1942, is given in memory of Miss Sydnor, who taught English and Math at Henry Clay High School for 26 years.

**Hanover Industrial Air Park Business Association** – \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior with a desire to continue their post-high school education including, but is not limited to, apprenticeships, technical colleges and schools, community colleges, military colleges and universities.

**J. K. Samples Scholarship** – Mr. J. K. Samples served as the Superintendent of Hanover County Public Schools from 1965 -1980 and was committed to quality education for all students. It is in this spirit that the J.K. Samples Scholarship Fund was established. The J.K. Samples Scholarship, funded through the estate of Mr. Samples and his wife, is to be awarded to graduates of Hanover County Public Schools to assist with their post-high school education. Scholarships up to \$3,000 are given to three students from all four high schools.

**Kevin Ritz Memorial Scholarship** – \$1,300 scholarship is given in memory of Kevin Ritz, a 1988 graduate of Lee-Davis High School and University of Virginia. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior at Lee-Davis High School that is interested in pursuing an education degree.

**Luther W. White Memorial Scholarship** - This scholarship in the amount of \$600 was set up by the Class of 1973 to honor their Class President Luther White. It is given to a Patrick Henry senior.

**Mario Colon Rivadeneira Memorial Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarship established by Mario's family will preserve and honor his memory by supporting a Lee-Davis High School graduate who aspires to make a significant contribution to the musical world. A second \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a senior attending either Atlee, Hanover, or Patrick Henry High school who wants to pursue a career in the musical world.

**The Insurance Doctor Scholarship** - \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior with a desire to continue their post-high school education.

Thanks to the **Cecil R. & Edna S. Hopkins Student Achievement Grant** awarded by Brenda Eggleston and Mary Butler Eggleston, fifth grade teachers Cathy Droppleman and Jimmy Johnson led the students of Elmont Elementary in a year long experience that integrated science and language arts. Their experience included field trips to Historic Polegreen Church and Monticello, excavating a simulated school yard colonial archaeological site, drawing detailed botanical drawings with the aid of Virginian artist Laura Call Gastinger, planting a Jeffersonian garden, researching, writing and professionally publishing a field guide, and hosting an 18th century fair for the third and fourth graders.

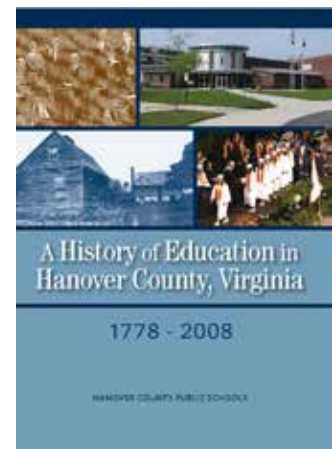


### HCPS Summer Reading Kickoff
